Fishing Made Possible by the Hebron State Fish Hatchery:

- Walleye and saugeye fry and fingerlings are produced to stock reservoirs statewide each spring for future fishing opportunities
- Channel Catfish are produced and stocked as “catchables” or yearlings
- Blue Catfish are spawned, hatched, and moved out for further production; broodstock (breeders) are kept on-site
- Bluegill “catchables” are produced for the State Fair Kids Fishing Pond and of all sizes for public pond renovation activities.



Hatchery Origin: Built in 1938 by the US Fish & Wildlife Service and transferred to the ODNR Division of Wildlife in 1982.

Renovation: Most recently renovated in 1994 for a new production building and re-working ponds.

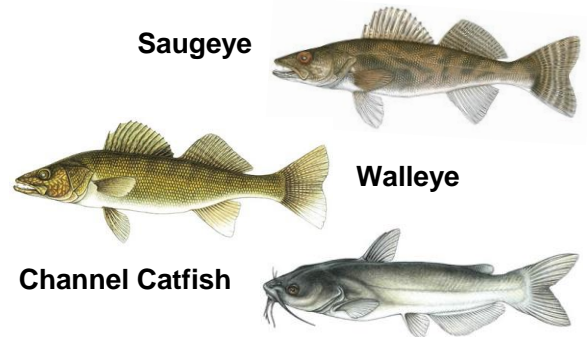
Water Sources: Two wells onsite and Buckeye Lake water transported through the adjacent Ohio-Erie Canal.

Fish Production Space: 13 indoor raceways, 2 production buildings and 63 ponds.

Staff: 4 Full-time and 2 Seasonal personnel

Fish Production and Stocking in Calendar Year 2020:

- Saugeye: 2.0 million fry and 2.5 million fingerlings
- Walleye: 0.8 million fry and 3.3 million fingerlings
- Channel Catfish: 2,717 catchables and 33,775 yearlings



Other Activities:

- Archery range and foot trails for wildlife viewing opportunities are open daily, sunrise to sunset.
- Controlled waterfowl and deer hunts are available. See www.ohiodnr.gov for details & sign-up.
- Contact hatchery personnel for limited fishing opportunities in the hatchery’s Borrow Pit Pond.
- Tours: Self-guided tours are permitted Monday-Friday from 8:00 AM – 3:00 PM, except Holidays. Guided tours are available by appointment; however, these have been eliminated or severely limited by COVID-19 restrictions.

Ohio Division of Wildlife Fish Hatcheries:

The Division operates six fish hatcheries that produce more than 40 million fish each year. Many Ohio fishing opportunities would not be available without fish production, stocking, management, and research. Funding is provided by the sales of Ohio fishing licenses and the Sport Fish Restoration Act, a federal aid program supported through excise taxes on select fishing tackle and marine fuel.
